The two weeks leading up to the tournament are a blur and this weekend's Selection Sunday is the culmination. But "it's all about the potential path," says Joe. "You need to see the bracket beginnings to see the path forward. It's not just about picking the top seeds to win." You need to look at the path

and it may not be what you think it was before Selection Sunday.

If you're a casual viewer of the NCAA College Basketball Tournament or a "fanatic" who fills out one or even multiple brackets, you likely enjoy chasing the win and testing the method to your madness.
